The McDonald Windows

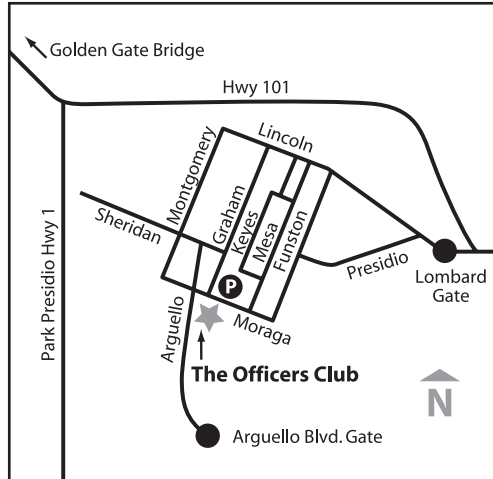


Frederick Alexander McDonald (1908-2003) served as U.S. Army Chaplain during World War II. Throughout Europe, he was dismayed by the destruction of sacred places, saving small shards from the broken stained glass windows where he found them in hopes that one day they could serve as testament to the sacrifices made by so many.

Today, 25 works of art incorporating these shards and Chaplain McDonald's memories of them have been created by thirteen artists and assembled into a special exhibit. They serve as a memorial to the places where they were found and offer hope for lasting peace so that such destruction will never be seen again.

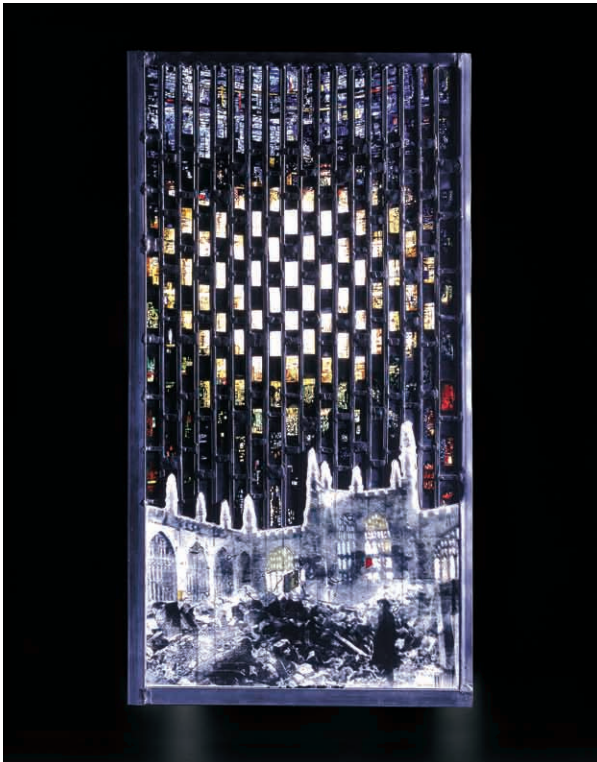
